This Fall, Kid's View gets cooking! Kid's View is a program for youth ages 10-13 which engages them in the world through photography. Kids will learn basic digital photography at Prairie's Northside studio and will travel into the community to learn about and photograph local food production. During our travels, students will learn about how different foods are raised, harvested and turned into healthy recipes. After photographing local farms and community gardens, students will work under the guidance of a local chef in the community kitchen at the Emanuel Community Center to develop and photograph their own dishes using locally sourced foods. At the end of the program, kids will create their own cookbooks using recipes developed by the Kid's View team and hold a public exhibit of their images.

Cost to participate: \$85

Schedule: This class meets from 9:30-11:00 am on Saturday mornings beginning September 11 and runs through November 27.

September 11: Meet at Prairie for introductions to staff and students. Introduction to local food production and photography. Learn basic camera operation. Creative exercise: Like I've Never Seen it Before.

September 18: Introduction to locally grown produce and organic farming. Visit to Permaganic organic farm to photograph.

September 25: Visit to local farm to learn more about food production.

October 2: Visit Mckie Recreation Center community garden to learn about water conservation and community gardening practices.

October 9: Return to Permaganic to check on progress of harvest. Photograph and begin to source ingredients for recipes.

October 16: Meet at Emanuel Community Center to cook and photograph.

October 23: Meet at Emanuel Community Center to cook and photograph.

October 30: Meet at Emanuel Community Center to cook and photograph.

November 6: Meet at Emanuel Community Center to cook and photograph.

November 13: Meet at Emanuel Community Center to cook and photograph.

November 20: Meet at Prairie to select final images, write captions and complete reflective writings.

November 27: Final celebration/exhibition at Prairie.

Enrollment and equipment :

Class enrollment is limited to a total of 12 students. All equipment necessary to complete the program is provided by Prairie including cameras and printers.

Outcomes:

Kid's View students learn about the world through artistic projects which directly involve them in important issues. They develop a personal vision through taking and editing their photographs and gain a basic understanding of the technical controls of digital photography. Students show their work to the community in a public exhibition, giving them an opportunity to express their understanding of issues they encountered during the program. Students hone their social skills and personal development through direct interaction with community organizations and leaders.

About Kid's View:

Kid's View began in March, 2009 and has connected kids with many community organizations including Mill Creek Restoration Project, Visionaries and Voices and Happen, Inc. through photography and writing projects.

Kid's View is produced by Prairie, Inc., a community arts program in the Northside neighborhood of Cincinnati which produces photography programs and art exhibitions. Kid's View is led by David Rosenthal, the founder and director of Prairie, Inc. This fall, Kid's View partners with Permaganic, Inc. Permaganic, Inc. was founded in 2009 by Luke and Angela Ebner to engage inner city youth in sustainable organic farming practices.
